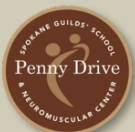


Saturday, April 28th VISIT GUILDSCHOOL.ORG FOR A LOCATION NEAR YOU.

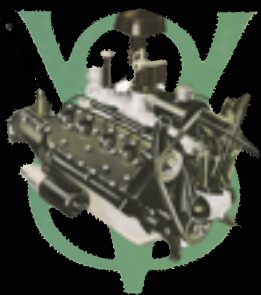

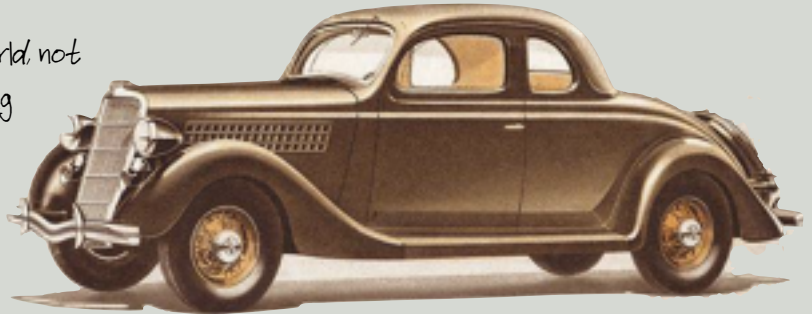
